This will take place on May 21 at 12:30 PM, so mark your calendar and plan to join us for this important learning session in our Christian Life Center. Alexander Pope is credited with the phrase, "Fools rush in where angels fear to tread." And several biblical proverbs speak to the wisdom of carefully contemplating one's steps, rather than rushing forward impetuously without thinking. So, with that in mind, let's all do our homework, doing all we can to inform ourselves. And, let's make sure that we also "proceed with much prayer" asking that our "way will be made plain". Our church's future is ultimately in God's hands, but each of us are a part of the decision -making process that will determine what that future will look like.

## **Epworth Offering**




Each year, Epworth Children's Home provides care to children in own communities our who have experienced
