The Way Forward Committee

To Our Wightman UMC Family,

The following article is offered as a reminder and update to the activities of your committee charged with aiding in discernment of the evolution and changes within the United Methodist denomination. As you will remember from previous newsletters, the Wightman UMC Administrative Council established The Way Forward Committee, a group charged with providing clear, transparent, and factual information to the congregation of Wightman United Methodist Church regarding the pivotal decision of church affiliation.

The Way Forward Committee wishes to offer a number of processes and opportunities to aid on your personal discernment on affiliation issues.

- 1. The Intercessory prayer group continues to seek God's wisdom and all members are encouraged to include prayer as a central part of this process.
- 2. A web page has been developed and is available to help guide you through the process and aid in resources which you may find helpful in your discernment.

- 3. Three face to face sessions will be held in the sanctuary in January to allow interaction with subject matter experts to further your discernment.

January 14th at 4:00 p.m. – Rev. Michael Turner will present the issues surrounding disaffiliation. January 21st at 4:00 p.m. – Rev. Cathy Jamieson will present the issues surrounding United Methodist Church affiliation.

January 28th at 4:00 p.m. – The Administrative Council and Finance Committee will present options and thoughts on the financial implications of disaffiliation.

The questions, which members provided in December, will be distributed to these three groups for incorporation into their presentations.

4. A congregational meeting will be scheduled for February 2024; led by the District Superintendent, at which an affiliation vote will be held. The specifics of this meeting are still in development but best knowledge to date states that this will be a church member only, written ballot, process.

Additionally, many members are seeking guidance on where Wightman will land denominationally/congregationally if disaffiliation occurs. The Way Forward Committee, at this point, can only provide the vision that another discernment period will exist after the February 2024 vote, to weigh options on the stance of Global Methodist affiliation, Independent, or other options. This will certainly have a role into your discernment, but only your personal research can play into that consideration at this point as the fundamental issue of disaffiliation must be first addressed. As The Way Forward Committee has seen first-hand and has addressed in our meetings, much rumor and disinformation exists and discernment must incorporate your personal research to seek the truth in God's direction.

Please know the committee will continue working diligently to gather necessary information and will provide regular updates to the Administrative Council and our congregation.
