A seasoned pastor I know tells the story of a man in one of the churches he served, who was a single father of a young son. The two of them lived within walking distance of the church and regularly came and sat together during worship. On one particular Sunday, however, the pastor noticed the young boy sitting by himself, so afterwards he asked the boy about his father. "Oh. couldn't make it today. He's got spots!" the boy said as he turned and walked away. "Spots?" "That sounds serious! Could be chicken pox, a rash or hives," thought the pastor.



Concerned, he went by to check on him on his way home. When he knocked on the door, the father answered it, looking perfectly healthy. "What can I do for you, preacher?" He asked. "Well, I came to see how you're feeling?" "Feeling, I'm feeling fine, why do you ask?" "Well, we missed you in church and your boy said you had spots." Puzzled, the two of them called the boy and asked him about what he meant. He said, "Dad, remember I asked you if you were going to church today and you said you weren't because it rained last night and left spots on your car, and you had to stay home and wash 'em off."

We might chuckle at this story. But on a more-serious note, do "spots" too easily keep you from church? If not "spots", what is your excuse for missing church?

If the truth be told, we have probably all used a lame excuse now and again for not going to church. And if we rarely miss church, and for good reason, that's understandable. But when missing church becomes a habit or pattern, it's time to take an honest look at your relationship to Christ and recommit yourself to Him and His Church. Ask yourself this question, "If everyone was as faithful in their church attendance as I, what kind of church would it be?"
